What did we decide?

• <u>Regarding the profile of the participating students: Most of the students have fewer</u> opportunities because of social or economic obstacles or learning difficulties.

-49 students from Romania aged 10-14 will participate in the activities. Those who will travel will be 12-13 years old.

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-5 classes from Italy aged 10-14 will participate in the activities. Those who will travel will be 12-13 years old.

-Different classes from Portugal aged 10-14 will participate in the activities. Those who will travel will be 12-13 years old.

-4 classes from Spain aged 13-14 will participate in the activities. Those who will travel will be 13-14 years old.

-Different classes from Greece aged 12-15 will participate in the activities. Those who will travel will be 14-16 years old. They are students in a special education programme.

• <u>Regarding the tasks, responsibilities and the dissemination tools in English and in</u> national languages (Facebook page, eTwinning, website...).

Melinda (RO) reminded each partner of their responsibilities and showed us how to update the website of our project: Update- Edit- Save. We agreed on keeping the Facebook page and the Facebook group active, as it seems it is the most convenient dissemination tool for us. We can all add administrators and publish in any of the tools. Every country must have their own dissemination tool in their language (blog, website, Facebook...). Melinda (RO) told us the survey for students is going well and we already have many answers.

• <u>Regarding the rules for the Logo contest.</u>

The contest will run from the 22nd of January to the 17th of February. On the 18th of February we must know the winner from every school. The logo must be original, not digital, and contain the 5 flags involved in the project, the title of the project and the Erasmus + logo. Every school will exhibit the logos presented and will vote on the best one. Once we know which logo is the winner in every school we must send it to Melinda (RO) and upload it to the Facebook group. From the 19th to the 21st of February every school will vote for the logos from the other schools (nobody can vote for their own school). Every logo can get 12, 10, 8 or 6 votes. If there is a draw, we will vote again and choose 1 from the 2 most-voted logos. We will communicate to Melinda (RO) which logos are the three most voted ones in our school. The final winner will be announced on February the 26th.





• <u>Regarding the template for the student's Learning Diary.</u>

It's very important that we make the students aware of the fact that outdoor activities have learning objectives. The students should reflect on what they have done and learnt at the end of every outdoor activity. Every school can have its own template for this, as long as it has the Erasmus + logo and our logo.

• <u>Regarding the template for lesson plans/activity descriptions (outdoor lessons for each school subject).</u>

At the end of the project we will publish a book with all the outdoor activities. Greece is in charge of this. We should all have a template for every activity, with the learning objectives of the activity, the number of students involved, etc. Gabriela (SP) will send Eleni (GR) a template she has from another book she has participated in.

• <u>Setting the dates for the next Transnational meeting in Italy.</u>

Other matters?

- Helena (PO) suggests talking about the profile of the host families. Greece is not going to be allocated in families because they have asked not to be, but if possible, students in Portugal and Spain will be in families. Families need to understand they are hosts and they must do activities with the students.
- We talk about how the selected students will communicate with the selected students from the other countries before their trip. A Facebook group/Whatsapp group can be created for this purpose.
- Melinda (RO) reminds us to make sure beforehand we know what documents are necessary to travel abroad with our students (passport, police permits...) and if our students have any allergies, food requirements or if they take medication.
